

# Texas Real Milk

## A project of the Farm and Ranch Freedom Alliance

Whether you call it real milk, farm fresh milk, or raw milk, Texans can buy unpasteurized, unhomogenized milk from cows and goats that are raised on pasture-based farms. But consumers' choices are limited by regulations that limit sales to "the point of production, i.e. the farm." In other words, to buy raw milk, individuals have to drive out to the farm, which may be 2 or 3 hours away. This regulation burdens consumers and penalizes family farmers.

We are working to get a bill passed to legalize the sale of raw dairy products by licensed farmers directly to consumers at any agreed-upon location, including farmers' markets and private drop points.
